# Smudging Ceremony in Ashern

Interlake-Eastern health staff received the keys to the inpatient unit expansion in Ashern on Monday this week. It marks a milestone in the project as we have officially taken ownership of the building from the contractors hired to build it.

Regional knowledge keeper, Robert Maytwayashing, offered a smudging ceremony to purify the new space and help create a positive mind set. The ceremony respects the spiritual and cultural practices of First Nations and Métis people who attend Ashern's Lakeshore General Hospital.

Staff were invited to participate in the first part of the ceremony. Robert then walked through each of the rooms in the new in-patient unit offering the smudge ceremony to the new spaces.

The expanded unit offers 26 beds, an increase of 12, and it is scheduled to accept patients on Feb. 3, 2025. Construction on the hospital's emergency department expansion will follow.

#### National Ribbon Skirt Day - Jan. 4

On Jan. 4, <u>National Ribbon Skirt Day</u> originates with the story of Isabella Kulak. A member of Cote First Nation, Saskatchewan, Isabella was shamed for wearing her handmade ribbon skirt to a formal wear day at her elementary school.

Traditionally worn by First Nations and Métis peoples, ribbon skirts are a centuries-old symbol of identity, adaptation and survival for Indigenous women, girls and gender-diverse people. They represent a direct connection to Mother Earth.

Isabella's story shone a light on the enduring injustices, racism and discrimination faced by First Nations, Inuit and Métis in Canada every day, and on the importance of the role we all have to play in making sure that what happened never happens again to anyone in Canada.
